


GO by Spark - How to assign/remove a Theme Night on a Day Level?

This guide provides step-by-step instructions on how to add a Theme Night on a Day Level using GO by Spark software. By following these steps, users can easily customize their itinerary and enhance the guest experience with themed events or activities.

1 Navigate to your GO Software URL and open the Itinerary Page.

2 The example below shows that this day has a Theme Night assigned.



3 Click the "Edit" icon to assign or remove a Theme Night.
